CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Dear Residents

Annual Picnic in the Park - this is being held on Sunday 8 June this year. I hope you will all come along and enjoy the fun and activities, most of which are free! There will be food outlets to buy food from, or bring your own picnic.

New Village Hall - this is now up and running and anyone wishing to hire the upstairs (lift installed) should contact the Clerk in the first instance. A nursery will be hiring the downstairs.

Would you like to be a Parish Councillor? There is currently a vacancy on the East Ward for anyone who is interested in making a difference in their community. If you would like to know more, please read the information in this newsletter or contact the Clerk.

Budget/Precept - this was agreed at the November meeting of the Parish Council and has been kept the same as the previous year, no increase (see inside for details of this and the end of year **Financial Statement** for 2024-25).

Dog fouling has been more prevalent this year than in any other year I have known! I cannot understand why dog owners/walkers do not pick up after their dog. What is really hard to believe is that some people take their dogs into the children's play areas and allow their dog to foul and then don't pick it up. This is totally unacceptable and is very dangerous for children. New **CCTV** cameras have been put up at the Leisure Centre and if anyone is caught not picking up, the Parish Council will name and shame them and report them to Chorley Council who will issue a fine, as it is against the law. This is also happening on the Tansley Avenue Play, where children play football on the grassed areas and also Coppull United FC have some children's matches there.

Grants - The Parish Council agreed to sponsor a safety book for local school children and Coppull Parish School was the recipient. Other organisations to benefit from a grant are: Methodist Church towards the Christmas Tree, Coppull Brownies towards activities.

Christmas Lights - I would like to thank everyone who helped with the installation of the lights and the switch on event. It was a very cold and wet evening for the event, but residents still attended and was enjoyed by all. I do hope the weather is better though for next year's event!

COPPULL NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN UPDATE



As a Steering Group we have exciting news to share!

The Neighbourhood Plan has successfully cleared all the stages required in the screening process and is just awaiting management sign off by Chorley Council.

This was an official consultation with three statutory bodies (The Environment Agency; Historic England & Natural England) to make sure that a Strategic Environment Assessment (SEA) was not required for the plan to proceed. Once this has been officially received by Coppull Parish Council, we can begin the next formal stage. Please keep an eye out on social media, the Parish Council website and in the Library for further notification of the next step.

The Steering Group are looking forward to bringing the plan to fruition and made law before the end of this year, it has been a long journey, sometimes elating other times frustrating but we are determined to make this happen for the village.

COULD YOU BE A PARISH COUNCILLOR?

There is a vacancy on the Parish Council for the East Ward. The vacancy has been advertised by Chorley Council and, as an election was not called for, the Parish Council can now co-opt. This post will be up for election again in May 2027.

If you feel you could make a difference, please send your details to the Parish Council Clerk, with a brief outline of why you would like to become a Parish Councillor.

What is a Parish Council? A parish council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish and has an overall responsibility for the well-being of its local community. It is the level government closest to the community, with the district authority above it in the hierarchy, and then the county council. As it is the authority closest to the people, parish councils are invariably the first place people will go with concerns or ideas. For this reason they are a vital part of any community. Its work falls into three main categories:

- 1. Representing the local community,
- 2. Delivering services to meet local needs
- 3. Striving to improve quality of life in the parish

Why become a Parish Councillor? By becoming a parish councillor you become someone your community will look to for help, guidance and support, a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve. Seeing your community change for the better, as a result of decisions you have helped make, is something that can give you a sense of achievement and pride.

What decisions do Parish Councils make? Parish councils make all kinds of decisions on issues that affect the local community. Probably the most common topics that parish councils get involved with are planning matters (they are statutory consultees), crime prevention, helping local groups, managing open spaces and campaigning for and delivering better services and facilities.

It's true to say that on their own, parish councils have limited powers to make decisions. But they do have the ability to negotiate with, and the power to influence, those other organisations that do make the final decisions (such as the borough or unitary council, health authorities, police, etc).

In this respect parish councils are extremely powerful. The organisations that make the final decisions know that a parish council gives the best reflection of how a community feels about something, and its views will be taken seriously.

How much time does it take up? Councils usually meet once a month for the council meeting, to which members of the public are also invited. Meetings may last two or three hours, depending on the agenda set for the meeting to discuss. Some councils have committees to deal with specific subjects, such as environmental issues. In addition to the regular meetings, councillors are required to attend other meetings representing the council, for example acting as a representative on an outside body, community activities or helping develop a new project for the community. Such meetings won't happen every day, so it's not going to take over your life.

How long does a parish councillor serve for? Once elected, parish councillors sit on the council for a maximum of four years. If they then want to stay in the post they can stand for re-election. Applicants should note that Councillors are expected to attend regular meetings and any additional meetings as may be arranged, and to

represent the electors of Coppull in raising and discussing those issues of interest and concern on which the Parish Council is empowered to act.

Am I eligible to be a Parish Councillor? You have to be:

- a British subject, or a citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union over 18 years of age and additionally you have to be one of the following:
- a local government elector for the council area for which you want to stand have during the whole of the 12 months occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole period have during that same period had your principal or only place of work in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole period.

You cannot stand for election if you:

- are subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order.
- have, within five years before the day of the election, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine.
- you work for the council you want to become a councillor for (but you can work for other local authorities, including the principal authorities that represent the same area).

You don't have to be connected to a political party. If you do become a parish councillor you will have to sign up to the Code of Conduct.

What powers do parish councils have? They have a wide range of powers which essentially related to local matters, such as looking after community buildings, open space, allotments, play areas, street lighting, bus shelters, car parks and much more. The council also has the power to raise money through taxation, the precept. The precept is the parish council's share of the council tax. The precept demand goes to the billing authority, the district council, which collects the tax for the parish council.

Parish Duties. Coppull Parish Council has 15 Councillors who stand for election every four years. The duties and functions of a parish council are many and varied.

The Council meets monthly and considers planning applications and any other matters referred to it by local residents. All meetings are open to the public and there is a forum before the start of the meeting at which members of the public can raise concerns and ask questions. All meetings are advertised on the council notice boards and on this website. Residents can bring to the attention of the parish council anything that concerns them, either directly or though the clerk. If matters raised are not the responsibility of the council, the clerk can bring them to the attention of the proper authority.

The Annual Parish Assembly. This is a meeting for residents to find out what the Parish Council does. It is usually held in April and everyone is very welcome.

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY

As you will see from the above financial statement, the Parish Council has received a substantial amount of CIL funding in this financial year. The Village Hall has been constructed using CIL funding, nothing has come out of the precept for this.

All the Parish Council owned play areas in Coppull are to be upgraded using CIL funding and repairs to the Leisure Centre building will also be undertaken. After this, local organisations can apply for CIL funding.

What can the Community Infrastructure Levy be spent on?

The levy can be used to fund a wide range of infrastructure, including transport, flood defences, schools, hospitals, and other health and social care facilities. This definition allows the levy to be used to fund a very broad range of facilities such as play areas, open spaces, parks and green spaces, cultural and sports facilities, healthcare facilities, academies and free schools, district heating schemes and police stations and other community safety facilities. Local authorities must spend the levy on infrastructure needed to support the development of their area, and they will decide what infrastructure is needed. The levy can be used to increase the capacity of existing infrastructure or to repair failing existing infrastructure, if that is necessary to support development.
